### ACE CREDIT<sup>®</sup> Clients in *Training* Magazine's Top 125



Released annually by *Training* magazine, the Training Top 125 ranks companies with the most successful learning and development programs. The Top 125 ranking is determined by assessing a range of qualitative and quantitative factors, including financial investment in employee development and the scope of development programs. This year's list featured five companies that participate in ACE's College Credit Recommendation Service (CREDIT), including Jiffy Lube International (which placed second overall) and Walgreens (one of five companies that received *Training*'s Best Practice Award).

#### Jiffy Lube International (#2)

Jiffy Lube's second-place finish can be attributed to its focus on helping high-performing employees obtain access to higher education. That's why Jiffy Lube University, the company's lauded technical, customer service, and management training program, approached CREDIT to review its curriculum and offer college credit recommendations. Jiffy Lube U underwent an ACE review in 2011 and again in 2014. Today the program has received ACE college credit recommendations for 25 semester hours. With 45 percent of Jiffy Lube service center employees either enrolled or considering enrollment in higher education, ACE credit recommendations demonstrate an organizational commitment to their professional growth. "For service center technicians interested in college or a technical school, these hours provide a significant jumpstart toward helping them achieve their professional development goals. And this benefit serves as an additional recruiting and retention tool for Jiffy Lube franchisees," said Kenneth Barber, Jiffy Lube's manager of learning and development.

#### Walgreens (#25)

Walgreens was one of five companies to receive a Best Practice Award. The credit belongs to Walgreens University (IL), the company's innovative, leader-led training program for employees at all levels. The Walgreens University curriculum equips team members to deliver extraordinary customer care (ECC), which is critical to company success. Walgreens employees internalize ECC behaviors through interactive tool kits, reference cards, and short training events delivered throughout the year. Since 2012, Walgreens employees have been able to use ACE credit recommendations to help transfer their training toward college and university credits.

#### McDonald's (#42)

McDonald's Hamburger University takes employee development seriously, and has received ACE credit recommendations for 72 of its courses. With over 50 years of experience training employees, Hamburger U knows how to adapt to the needs of a changing workforce. It recently launched the English Under the Arches program, which delivers ESL courses to high-potential employees. The results are impressive, with an 87 percent increase in oral proficiency among participants, and an 88 percent retention rate among employees one year after graduation.

Based in Grand Haven, Michigan, Shape Corp. is renowned worldwide as the trendsetter in automotive and industrial component manufacturing, and is committed to training employees to be the best in the industry. ACE credit recommendations have been offered for Shape Corp. certifications since 2007.

Pacific College (CA) was formed in 1993 by community college educators with the primary goal of providing high-quality vocational education responsive to the training needs of medical aspirants, as well as to the employment demands in professional allied health occupations.

In California, there is a demand for nurses but the community college system does not have the capacity to address this need. Potential nursing students are unable to bridge the gap to the registered nursing program because they lack the accessibility to prerequisite courses. Aligned with its mission and in response to the college graduates, program advisory members, and the community at large, the college designed a pre-nursing certificate to facilitate this pursuit of further education by prospective nursing students.

Pacific College recently obtained ACE college credit recommendations for some of its physical and life sciences courses.

### **Success Profiles** ACE's 2015 Student of the Year



Jeffrey (L.J.) Gearhart

It takes a tremendous amount of focus and determination to manage a multi-million dollar restaurant while attending college full time. That's why Jeffrey (L.J.) Gearhart received the ACE Student of the Year Award at ACE's 97th Annual

Meeting in Washington, DC. Gearhart, 24, is currently the general manager of a McDonald's restaurant in Bloomington, Indiana, where he has been working 45 hours a week while completing a degree at Ivy Tech Community College. In addition to his management duties, Gearhart teaches shift management excellence courses at his and four other McDonald's restaurants in the area.

Gearhart used ACE credit recommendations to successfully apply credit from classes at McDonald's Hamburger University (IL) toward a degree in business administration and a certificate in human resources management. He graduated in May 2015, a semester earlier than expected, and will be the first in his family to obtain a college degree.

"I am honored to work for a company that offers ACE credit recommendations to assist me and other learners in obtaining the college degrees and certifications that will help us advance our personal and professional ambitions," Gearhart said. "My goal is to inspire others the way I have been inspired by my mentors."

The Student of the Year Award, formerly the Adult Learner of the Year Award, is presented annually by ACE to an individual who has benefited academically or professionally from the use of ACE credit recommendations. Recipients must demonstrate outstanding achievements in their community or workplace while successfully balancing the demands of family, career, and education.
