Gil Latz, President, Association of International Education Administrators and Associate Vice Chancellor for International Affairs, Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis

Gil Latz is a Professor of Geography, Philanthropy, and Associate Vice Chancellor for International Affairs, Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis and Associate Vice President for International Affairs, Indiana University. His comparative regional development policy research includes affiliation with Tokyo University (Japan) and University of Florence (Italy).

Until 2012, he was affiliated with Portland State University, Portland, Oregon; over his 28-year appointment at PSU, he held positions in: Geography, International Studies, and as Vice Provost for International Affairs. In 2009, Dr.

Latz chaired the submission that garnered PSU the NAFSA: Association of International Educators, Senator Paul Simon Award for Exemplary Campus Internationalization. Dr. Latz is a graduate of Occidental College (BA, 1974). His graduate research training took place at the University of Chicago (1976-1980; MA, 1978) and the University of Tokyo (1980-84); in 1986 he was granted the Ph.D. in Geography from the University of Chicago.

He has a longstanding interest in curricular internationalization, including publications on the intersection of internationalization, diversity, and community engagement, global learning for all, and assessing study abroad.

Recent publications: assessing international learning (US); landscape history (Italy/US); civil society leadership (Japan); and transnational regional development (Asia). He serves as Association of International Education Administrators (AIEA) Past President, 2017-18; and Senior Associate for Internationalization, ACE.
